

CLINICAL ASSISTANT PROFESSOR IN SPECIAL EDUCATION

The Indiana University School of Education's Department of Curriculum & Instruction invites applications for a Clinical Assistant Professor in Special Education. The position is a ten month academic appointment beginning August 2018. The new faculty member will be expected to participate in appropriate service obligations such as departmental and school committees, and maintain a minimum nine credit hour course load each semester during the academic year by teaching and/or conducting clinical supervision. Teaching and supervision activities may take place at the graduate and undergraduate level, using online, hybrid, and traditional instructional formats. Developing and maintaining high quality field experiences within K-12 settings is required.

The special education program seeks applicants with a broad knowledge of the field of special education, who are committed to enhancing clinical practice within the K-12 school context. The successful applicant will be expected to teach, advise, mentor, work closely with our K-12 partners, support program evaluation and research efforts, and supervise undergraduate and graduate students in the field.

Qualifications

Required qualifications: 1) an earned doctorate by the date of employment in an area related to special education 2) substantive experiences working in K-12 settings; 3) understanding K-12 settings and being able to successfully interface with K-12 personnel; and 4) evidence of interest in or experience of successful university teaching, as well as course, program, and clinical development in teacher preparation.

Highly desirable qualifications: 1) demonstrated commitment to teamwork and competence as a collaborator; 2) experience mentoring undergraduate and graduate students in field experiences; and 3) experience working with children with special needs (disabilities) in K-12 school environments.

Responsibilities of this position include:

- Active participation with faculty in the School of Education and service on appropriate committees.
- Advising and mentoring undergraduate and graduate students.
- Teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in special education.
- Complex program administration, including planning, organizing, and supervising field experiences.
- Leadership in program/course development, refinement, and evaluation, including leading of ongoing accreditation and improvement activities.
