ROLE of the POSITION	Visiting Faculty This is a 9-month non-tenure track position effective fall 2017 semester. It is potentially renewable contingent on funding. Responsibilities will require the successful candidate to teach 4 courses per semester as well as participate in college and departmental activities.
QUALIFICATIONS	 Required Qualifications: Earned master's degree in special education or closely related field (Visiting Lecturer rank) or earned doctoral degree in special education or closely related field (Visiting Assistant Professor rank). If enrolled in doctoral program, successful completion of dissertation proposal prior to start date. Teaching experience, preferably in higher education Teaching experience in K-12 settings, preferably some experience working with children with disabilities. Special consideration will be given to candidates whose professional and academic focus has been on meeting the needs of historically under-served and under-represented racial and ethnic groups. Bilingual/multilingual candidates are encouraged to apply.
SALARY RANGE	Salary competitive with those at similarly situated institutions. Position is contingent upon funding.
