

## **Doctoral Leadership Training at Utah State University**

### **Interdisciplinary Transition Service and Research to Improve Post-School Outcomes for Youth with Disabilities**

The Department of Special Education and Rehabilitation at Utah State University announces a doctoral leadership training grant preparing individuals for faculty positions in higher education with *expertise in interdisciplinary transition service and research*. The program will focus on (1) interdisciplinary collaboration in schools, postsecondary education, and working with families; (2) internships in multiple settings; and (3) applied research. Scholars will engage with professionals in multiple disciplines to meet an individual's self-determined goals for adulthood. The program consists of 63 credit hours of rigorous scholarship, fieldwork, teaching, and research leading to a Ph.D. in Disability Disciplines.

Qualifications include (1) a master's degree in special education, rehabilitation counseling, or a related discipline; (2) potential for high-level scholarship in graduate school; and (3) two years experience in a relevant field, preferably working with youth in transition from school to adulthood.
