The Department of Special Education at Illinois State University (ISU) in Normal, IL, invites applications for a tenure-track position to be filled at the rank of Assistant/Associate Professor in the area of Literacy.

Position: This tenure-track position, to start on August 16, 2019, is a nine-month position with the opportunity for summer employment. Responsibilities may include teaching undergraduate and graduate courses, conducting and supervising research activities, seeking external funding, and providing university and professional service. Salary is commensurate with experience and qualifications.

Required Qualifications: Applicants must hold an earned doctorate in special education or related field with expertise in high-incidence disabilities with a focus on literacy (ABD considered). State law mandates demonstrable oral proficiency in the English language as a requirement for this position. Employment is contingent upon passing a satisfactory criminal background investigation.

Desired Qualifications: Priority will be given to applicants who have experience teaching literacy to individuals with high-incidence disabilities, university teaching experience, and an active research agenda. Individuals with experience in culturally responsive pedagogy or civic engagement are strongly encouraged to apply.

Application Procedure: Initial review of candidates will begin September 27, 2018 and will continue until the position is filled.
