- Evidence of pursuing extramural funding (preferred).

- Commitment to inclusive education.
- Expertise in equity and diversity (preferred).
- At least three years of professional experience working with students with disabilities (preferred).

- 1) Teach undergraduate and graduate courses within the department
- 2) Advise undergraduate, masters and doctoral students
- 3) Participate in faculty governance and other service to the university, department and profession
- 4) Maintain active research and pursue extramural funding to support research
