



### **Clinical Assistant Professor – Special Education**

The Department of Communication Sciences and Special Education at the University of Georgia invites applications for the position of *Clinical Assistant Professor* in Special Education. This is a non-tenure-track position to begin August 2020.

**Responsibilities** will include:

- Teach courses in the low-incidence disabilities programs, which prepare preservice teachers to work with individuals with moderate/severe disabilities and autism spectrum disorder in P-12 school classrooms
- Supervise practicum students and student teachers in field placements
- Provide instruction and support to assist students in successful completion of edTPA
- Participate in the ongoing development and revision of the existing low-incidence teacher preparation programs
- Contribute to department, college, university, and professional service

**Required Qualifications** for this position include the following:

- Terminal degree in special education or a related field
- Minimum one year or more experience in a P-12 special education classroom
- One or more years of experience in college teaching
- One or more years of experience in supervision of preservice teachers in special education classrooms

**Preferred Qualifications** for this position include the following:

- One or more years of experience with the edTPA process
- One or more years of experience with individuals with severe, profound, and multiple disabilities

**Appointment** will be for 9 months, renewable on an annual basis. Additional opportunities for summer employment may be available. Salary will be competitive and commensurate with experience and qualifications.
