



Assistant Professor in Early Childhood Special Education

The Special Education Program in the Division of Professional Specialized Studies at the University of Nevada, Reno is seeking outstanding candidates for a full-time **tenure track** faculty position at the Assistant Professor –II rank, in Early Childhood Special Education with a specialization in Early Intervention beginning on July 1, 2020. The successful candidate will have demonstrated leadership skills and experience working with people from a variety of cultures and backgrounds.

RESPONSIBILITIES. Responsibilities include: conducting research, writing grants, and engaging in other scholarly activities; teaching and developing online and in-person graduate and undergraduate courses in special education with emphases in Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education, supervising field experiences; advising master's and doctoral students and chairing graduate committees; contributing to program development; participating in CAEP and other college performance assessment activities; and providing service and outreach to the university and to the profession.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS. The candidate must possess:

- An earned doctoral degree from an accredited institution of higher education in Special Education; or a closely related field. ABD may be considered if all other qualities of the candidate are excellent and the candidate has confirmation of a scheduled completion date.
- At least two years of experience providing direct services to young children and their families who are receiving Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education (EI/ECSE) services.
- Effective instructional practices in teaching undergraduate and/or graduate courses in EI/ECSE.
- Depth of knowledge and experience in EI/ECSE.
- Evidence of scholarly productivity or potential in scholarship directly related to the field of special education, specifically EI/ECSE.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS. Preference will be given to applicants who:

- Have experience in online course development and delivery.
- Have supervised student field experiences in EI/ECSE.
- Demonstrate an ability to work effectively with individuals with diverse abilities and their families.
- Possess skill and experience in grant acquisition and grant management.

TOTAL COMPENSATION. The total compensation package includes a negotiable competitive salary, moving allowance (if applicable), a rich retirement plan, health insurance options that include dental and vision, life insurance, long-term disability, along with many other benefits.
